

“Somewhere Over There.”

The following letter was received by Miss Eula Edwards from her cousin Pvt. Kennie R Andrews, somewhere in France.

Dear Cousin, I will write you a few lines tonight to let you know I am well hope this will find you all OK and having lots of fun, I sure wish I was back at Whitehead for a while, I bet I could have a nice time. I just got through some very hard battles; we lost two guns but no men; so I guess we will get a few days rest. We have been on the front over seven months already without relief, so I guess we will go back of the lines for a rest. Hope we will get back in some big town; we will sure have a fine time. I will send you a sample of the French money and a card picture, one showing a big tank we use they are mounted with 8 inch guns and machine guns and from 4 to 8 men to a tank, and one having the big [illegible] that carries food and ammunition to the front. I can't think of anything else so I will close. Tell all hello for me and answer real soon.
